 - This coming season hosting two clinics C1 and C2
 - Significant commitment from volunteers to be part of minor hockey

Christina LaRue - VP - House League

Christina presented her report – see attached PHA presentation.

- 1. Christina presented the Accomplishments of the House League Divisions this year as follows;
 - 50 teams with 668 registrants
 - New uniforms, Jerseys and socks for all participants
 - Tournament Play
 - Local President's Cup, Tyke Showdown, Mike Mulvaney Tournament, Atom Liftlock Tournament, Several away tournaments
 - PHA Roster Select Program Players play and practice together on their RS teams as well as with their HL team. 6 Teams (Novice, Atom's, Peewee's and Midget's) Teams

- played approximately 6 home & 6 away RS exhibition games versus other RS centers and 3 tournaments
- Year End Team Banquet and Photo Day was Changed in format of Photo Day and Banquet
- Volunteers 250+ working together for our kids! THANK YOU!
- 2. Christina also discussed 2019/2020 Objectives as follows;
 - Fiscal responsibility and further accountability Are we paying the correct fees for each individual age?
 - Roster assembly changes (1 goalie per team, roster size) due to available ice and financial commitments
 - Revamped Initiation Program We are purchasing rink dividers and implement Hockey Canada guidelines for cross ice training and development
 - Additional *Initiation* Ice time dedicated mid-week for additional/professional training and Goalie training throughout HL
 - Tournament Play Local: Tyke Jamboree, Presidents Cup, Mike Mulvaney Tournament, and Atom Liftlock Tournament
 - PHA Roster Select Program The RS program will exist with fewer teams due to ice issues (Novice, Atom, Peewee, Minor Bantam)
 - Need new leader, led by team effort

Scott Dickey -VP - Business

Scott D. presented his report – see attached PHA presentation.

- 1. Scott D. presented the Accomplishments of the Business this year as follows;
 - Completed updated registration policy for registering and paying for house league and rep hockey
 - Transitioned player registration from PHA website and PayPal to the Hockey Canada online registration and payment system
 - Utilizing the Hockey Canada registration system helped streamline the administration process helping enforce OMHA rules around rostering and participating in hockey
 - 100% of registration payments collected by deadline
 - Continued support and use of new financial assistance model "PHA Cares" offering financial assistance for families to play all levels of hockey
 - Set criteria, timelines and procedures to ensure utmost privacy & professionalism
 - Continued use of non-cash transactions by automatic deposit to referees, timekeepers and suppliers
 - New season training for managers on banking, budgeting and reporting requirements
 - Monitor and review monthly reporting by rep teams to parents, follow up as necessary
 - Continue relationship with both banking partners (KCU & Scotiabank)
 - Standardize sponsorship requirements and sponsorship packages with rep sponsor
 - Provide variance analysis for monthly actuals vs budget
- 2. Scott D. presented the Priorities of the Business this year as follows;
 - Continue tracking and reporting on monthly financial results vs amounts budgeted, discuss variances

- Continue to require compliance with Rep budgeting and disclosure
- Continue to transfer more suppliers to online payments
- Continue to work with City of Peterborough for easier ice details, invoicing and payments
- Identify and explore new sponsorship opportunities
- Work with executive to implement new Petes agreement and its impact on financial decisions
- Obtain accountant / auditor opinion on financial results
